- Paid memberships are up versus last summer in both major categories: Regular and Associate members
- Outstanding, or unpaid members are in decline versus the last report of April 2022
- For the period ended July 31, 2022, the Ontario chapter had gained 30 new members. I would ask long-time members to keep an eye out for less familiar faces and introduce yourself. You may have the chance to welcome a new member
- We may be starting to see an upswing in memberships after a few years of decline.

Outreach:

Our most common method of member communication is via the regular e-blasts from Head Office. However, we have no list of contacts who are outside of CHES that, in our humble opinion, should be considering membership. An exercise is currently underway to examine the places in the province in which hospitals have no representative to CHES. We have great representation in some regions and very little in others. A targeted effort to reach out to hospitals in under-represented areas may gain us more members. This is important for the sake of those hospitals, whose facilities teams could be gaining valuable education and networking by being part of CHES.

Outreach will likely need to involve actions like in-person or remote learning opportunities to help promote the value of membership.

National Membership

- Across Canada, membership had seen a 1% rise vs last year, and a 2% rise vs 2020, at this same time of the year. Perhaps it is time to start seeing growth again!

The National committee has struck a sub-committee to discuss ways in which to better reach out to the Long-Term Care segment of Canadian healthcare.
